- 14-19 years old
- High school student
- Queen Creek resident
- Maintains a "C" (2.0 GPA) average grade level or above
- Cannot have a criminal record or major traffic offense (i.e. DUI, reckless driving, etc.), or be associated with a gang in any way.
- Not have been convicted of a felony in this state, or convicted in another state/location of an offense that would be considered a felony in this state.
